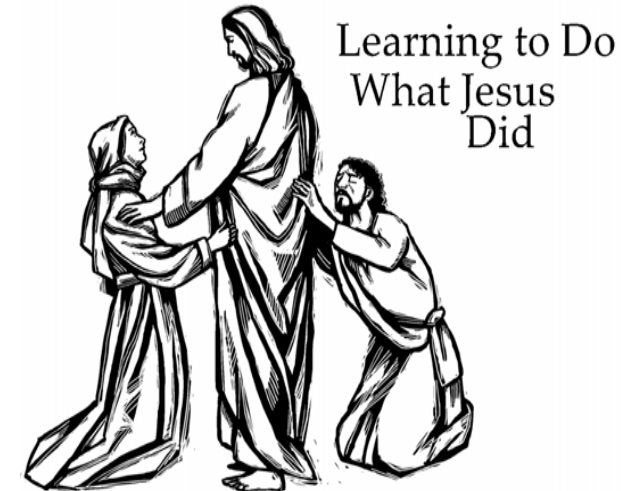

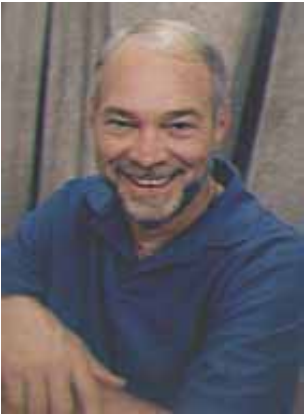

A. Learning to Care for the Care

Giver:

Those who provide care for others often neglect their own needs. Doing so can significantly impact the quality of life not only for them but for those who rely on them for care. This workshop offers some practical ways to look at self-care challenges and issues.

Madelaine (Madie) Yannaccone is a member of Holy Spirit Church and actively involved with the Order of St. Luke healing ministry. For 2-1/2 years, she has been working as an Activities Coordinator at two of Catholic Charities Day Break programs in Santa Clara County, which offer day care for Alzheimer's and dementia seniors. Madie was also a secondary caregiver to her father who passed away in 2000 from Alzheimer's. In June, 2008, she completed on-line Gerontology courses through American River College in Sacramento and received her Activities Assistant certificate.

B. Forgiveness isn't Optional: Learning to Forgive as Jesus Forgave

Forgiveness is essential but difficult and often complicated by life's wounds. This workshop is for anyone who has or has had someone to forgive. Phil's own challenges and life experiences give him ongoing confrontation with the issue of forgiveness.

Phil Svalya is a retired Navy Captain and former Navy SEAL. He is an attorney in private practice and identified as a pre-eminent trial lawyer by Martindale and Hubbell. Phil is a director of four Christian Charitable foundations. He is a member of the Association of Christian Therapists and a life member of the Order of St. Luke.
